GRAMMAR C

Simultaneous Actions: [V₁ (ADV.FORM) gachii, V₂] 'While doing V₁, do V₂'

This structure, $[V_1 gachii, V_2]$, indicates that one is doing V_1 and V_2 at the same time. V_1 before *gachii* is in the Adverbial Form. The final vowel of this form *-i* frequently changes to *-a*, resulting in variations such as *atcha-gachii* (\leftarrow *atchi-gachii* 'while walking') and *sa-gachii* (\leftarrow *shii-gachii* 'while doing').
